#### **♣** Introduction and Mission Statement

IRCA was founded on July 1, 2011, drawing inspiration from advocacy services provided by institutions such as the Italian Institute of Culture in Albania, the Goethe Institute, the British Council, the American Corner, as well as research and documentation centers at universities across Europe and North America, many of which the founders of IRCA have personally engaged with.

#### Vision:

External Vision (for beneficiaries): Roma communities are empowered, with meaningful access, engagement, representation, and participation in civic life and public decision-making at all levels. Internal Vision (for the organization): IRCA strives to be a leading organization that advocates for a multiethnic, inclusive society, grounded in the universal values of human rights and equality.

#### Mission:

IRCA is committed to fostering the equal and sustainable development of Roma communities by promoting advocacy, mobilization, empowerment, collaboration, policy-focused research, and participatory action. The organization works to ensure equal participation in democratic processes, fair access to rights and services, and the preservation and promotion of Roma culture and identity.

Through a combination of volunteer advocacy, educational services, and recreational activities, IRCA has established three key youth networks: the Romani Students' Network, the Romani Corps of Volunteers, and the Romani Youth Parliament Forum. Additionally, much of IRCA's work is broadcast through its online radio station, "Capitol"-Radio, which highlights and amplifies the organization's activities.




### Work

Impact of IRCA's work fall in 4 main categories:

The organizational structure of IRCA includes the Steering Board, Goodwill Advisors, the Executive Director, and a team of 20 staff members, consisting of 7 full-time and 13 part-time employees. Additionally, IRCA has established the Romani Corps of Volunteers, which comprises over 210 members, including both Roma and non-Roma students and graduates. Since 2011, IRCA has also directed the Body of Actors, Visual Artists, and Musicians, which has performed and organized more than 85 activities in the field of arts and culture.

### Throughout 2024, the Institute of Romani Culture in Albania has focused its efforts on:

### Institutional Strengthening

Enhancing staff capacities in project coordination, management, monitoring, evaluation, fundraising, and the development of internal policies and documents to improve organizational efficiency.

### **♣** Intercultural Engagement

Promoting inclusiveness and fostering relationships among individuals from diverse cultural, racial, and socioeconomic backgrounds. IRCA has emphasized respect for cultural diversity and created a supportive environment that values differences in race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, religion, age, ability, socioeconomic status, and language.

### **4** Youth Empowerment

Equipping young people with the necessary skills and capacities to become catalysts for positive change in their communities and beyond.

### Advocacy and Civic Participation

Implementing programs that enable Roma citizens to collectively advocate for changes in public policies and processes. This work has focused on empowering communities, promoting government transparency and accountability, and fostering responsive governance.

Throughout 2024, we successfully implemented the second phase of the project "ROMACTED - Promoting Good Governance and Roma Empowerment at the Local Level," funded by the European Union (DG NEAR) and the Council of Europe. This eight-year initiative was carried out in 10 municipalities: Elbasan, Përmet, Gjirokastër, Fier, Korçë, Vlorë, Pogradec, Lushnjë, Çerrik, and Roskovec.

The project equipped local authorities with tools and knowledge to better address Roma needs, improving their responsiveness and accountability. It also worked to enhance the efficiency and sustainability of local policies and services while fostering inter-municipal cooperation for joint integration projects, including the management of small grants of up to 15,000 euros for each municipality.



### **♣** Promoting Political Inclusion of Marginalized Youth in Albania

The project "Promoting Political Inclusion of Marginalized Youth in Albania", implemented by the Institute of Roma Culture in Albania (IRCA), was carried out with the generous support of the National Endowment for Democracy (NED) over the period July 2021 to June 2024.

### Key Achievements of the Initiative

- Podcast Production: Created and shared 10 podcasts discussing democracy, active citizenship, political participation, and government processes, reaching a wide audience.
- Youth-Led Initiatives: Supported 10 self-determined democracy initiatives led by trained youth, enabling them to implement their knowledge and skills in real-world contexts.
- Internship Opportunities: Facilitated 3-month internships for 30 Roma youth in collaboration with local and national government institutions, providing hands-on political experience.
- Roma Talks: Organized 16 public forums, titled "Roma Talks," to spotlight Roma concerns and engage decision-makers in addressing these issues.

# **Strengthening national and local systems to support the effective socio-economic integration of returnees in the Western Balkans**

With the support of the United Nations Development Programme Albania, within the framework of the project: "Strengthening national and local systems to support the effective socio-economic integration of returnees in the Western Balkans," IRCA implemented the project titled "Training services in entrepreneurship, business start-up, business growth and providing mentorship for returnees in Devoll, Berat, and Fier."

#### **Key Achievements of the Initiative**

- **Coaching Cycle Groups**: Organized coaching cycle groups in three regions of Albania: Berat, Fier, and Devoll, involving 80 young unemployed jobseekers.
- **Professional Guidance**: Guided participants toward professional courses or self-employment opportunities.
- **Employment Success**: Successfully facilitated the employment or self-employment of 43 participants in the initiative, helping them secure stable livelihoods.



### Increasing the Political Participation of Roma Youth

The "Increasing the Political Participation of Roma Youth" project, supported by the National Endowment for Democracy and the National Democracy Institute (NDI), focused on empowering Roma youth to actively participate in political life in Albania. It addressed various topics, including protection from hate speech, cyberbullying, and other forms of violence, with particular attention to gender issues. These efforts aimed to remove barriers to the inclusion of girls and women in political life.


# Erasmus+ project "EnCritMedYB (2023-2025)

The project aims to enhance the critical thinking and media literacy skills of young people in the Balkans through mutual digital learning and discussions that foster acceptance of differences and promote intercultural tolerance.

### To achieve this objective, the project will:


- Co-create educational materials addressing media literacy, critical thinking, and intercultural dialogue, tailored to the regional context and specific country realities.
- Disseminate these materials broadly to youth workers, young people, and civil society organizations (CSOs) in North Macedonia, Albania, Greece, and Kosovo.
- Organize and deliver 30 regional digital events that involve youth from the target countries, using the educational materials.
- Utilize these events as a platform to enhance critical thinking and media literacy skills among youth participants.
- Foster mutual digital learning and debate to build an environment of intercultural understanding and tolerance.





# **♣** Enhancing Albanian and Italian Youth to Support Disadvantaged Communities to Become Climate Change Resilient through Art and Culture (REACT)

With the support of **Allianz Foundation** and in partnership with Associazione di Promozione Sociale Giallo Sassi, IRCA has led the implementation of the project "Enhancing Albanian and Italian Youth to Support Disadvantaged Communities to Become Climate Change Resilient through Art and Culture (REACT)". The main goal of the project was to strengthen climate change resilience and transform the lives of communities by empowering youth through an international education program based on culture and art.



The project successfully created the Academy for Climate Ambassadors, training 40 youth from Albania and Italy to become agents of change in addressing climate change impacts on vulnerable communities. A series of 10 open lectures titled "Climate Talk" were held in schools and universities, fostering dialogue on climate change effects and solutions. The initiative also organized art competitions, exhibitions in Matera and Tirana, community workdays for environmental greening, and meetings with local governments to advocate for practical climate resilience measures. Additionally, the project produced a documentary on climate change consequences and concluded with impactful closing events in Tirana and Matera, bringing together youth, activists, and citizens to discuss and promote climate action.

### **AGORA**

The project titled "Advancing Gender Equality through Oversight and *Reporting in Albania" (AGORA*), funded by the **EU**, is implemented by the Institute of Romani Culture in Albania (IRCA) in collaboration with the Gender Alliance for Development Center (GADC) as the lead applicant and Together for Life (TFL). The project aims to empower diverse women's civil society organizations (WCSOs) and grassroots groups, including Roma and LGBTQI+ communities, to monitor and hold institutions accountable for implementing the legal framework on gender equality and addressing gender-based violence (GE&GBV). Targeted municipalities include Tiranë, Korçë, Lezhë, Kukës, Fier, and Elbasan. The initiative focuses on women and girls, particularly survivors of GBV, Roma women and girls, and LGBTQI+ individuals, alongside WCSOs, primary health care centers and practitioners, the Ministry of Health and Social Protection, municipal authorities (mayors, GBV coordinators, and referral mechanisms), the Parliament of Albania, and media representatives. By involving these stakeholders, the project seeks to enhance institutional accountability and strengthen efforts to promote gender equality and combat gender-based violence in Albania.





### Roma Culture and Tradition: A Value of Diversity in Albanian Cultural Heritage

With the support of the **Ministry of Economics, Culture, and Innovation**, IRCA implemented the project "Roma Culture and Tradition: A Value of Diversity in Albanian Cultural Heritage." This initiative aimed to revitalize Roma culture and folklore, providing support to young Roma artisans and stylists to showcase their talents and promote their crafts. The project also focused on fostering intercultural dialogue by emphasizing the importance of Roma identity as an integral component of Albania's rich cultural heritage. Roma youth were the central focus of the project, with tailored non-formal educational methods employed to deepen their understanding of Roma culture, traditions, and history. Through interactive learning, workshops, and creative activities, the youth engaged directly with their cultural roots, strengthening their sense of identity and pride while also fostering a greater appreciation for diversity within Albanian society.





### ♣ Transparency and Accountability in the Implementation and Reporting of Budgetary Expenditures under the National Action Plan for Equality, Inclusion, and Participation of Roma and Egyptians 2021-2025







With the support of IDM and EU funding, IRCA is "Transparency implementing the project Accountability in the Implementation and Reporting of Budgetary Expenditures under the National Action Plan for Equality, Inclusion, and Participation of Roma and *Egyptians 2021-2025.*" The general aim of the project is to enhance transparency and accountability regarding the implementation and budgeting of housing, employment, and empowerment issues outlined in the National Action Plan for the Integration of Roma for 2024. To achieve this, the project focuses on monitoring the allocation of budget funds dedicated to key strategic objectives of the National Action Plan. In addition, the project aims to strengthen the capacities of civil society actors and Roma and Egyptian communities in continuous monitoring and reporting on the implementation of the action plan.



As part of the project, a monitoring application has been designed, enabling users not only to access information about the progress of the National Action Plan for Equality, Inclusion, and Participation of Roma and Egyptians 2021-2025 but also to actively engage by sharing comments, suggestions, challenges, and positive practices across Albania.

Improving Roma Access to
Quality Healthcare and

The project Improving Roma Access to Quality Healthcare and Education Services" was implemented by IRCA in partnership with the "Rromano Kham" Association, financially supported by Together for Life as part of the SPACE grants. This initiative aimed to enhance the access of vulnerable groups to education and healthcare through the creation and empowerment of advocacy groups.

## Integration and Capacity Building of Saver Community Center in Lushnja

With the support of UNDP, IRCA is currently implementing the project "Integration and Capacity Building of Saver Community Center in Lushnja" (SAVER-4-ALL) in the Municipality of Lushnja. The main objective of the project is to contribute to the social integration and well-being of families in economic difficulty, particularly marginalized and vulnerable women, children, and elders, including those in need, marginalized and disadvantaged minorities such as the Roma and Egyptian communities, and people with disabilities residing in the Saver Administrative Unit of the Lushnja Municipality.





# Facilitating the Management of Social Care Cases for Returnees in the Municipality of Fier.

Supported by UNDP, this project focused on assisting returnees and improving their access to essential services, including education, healthcare, and employment. A key component was the provision of psychological support for girls and women who were victims of gender-based violence. This support included individual and group therapy sessions, art and play therapy, role-playing, and other therapeutic methods.

As part of the project, two supportive materials were developed: one designed for adults and another for children. These tools were centered on guiding the application of psychological techniques and served as a practical foundation for enhancing resilience and self-care. Inspired by the approach of the "Positive Thinking Clinic," the documents aimed to strengthen individuals' mental well-being and coping mechanisms. Both tools were published on IRCA's social media platforms, making them widely accessible. The project successfully facilitated the management of at least 50 cases involving returnees and their families in the Municipality of Fier, ensuring access to social care services. Additionally, it provided psychosocial services and empowerment to at least 40 women and 60 children and youth from marginalized groups, contributing to their overall well-being and social inclusion.



### A project for mental health!

# The Western Balkans Forum on the Institutionalization of the Romani Language

IRCA has organized the Western Balkans Forum on the *Institutionalization of the Romani Language* in collaboration with the European Roma Institute for Arts and Culture (ERIAC) in Berlin, the Municipality of Elbasan, and "Aleksandër Xhuvani" University. This forum brought together linguists, academics, representatives of local and central institutions, members of the diplomatic corps in Albania, Romani language teachers, activists, students, and other stakeholders from across the Western Balkans. The primary focus of the forum was to address the urgent need for documenting the language, traditions, and culture of the Romani minority, alongside concrete efforts to enhance their social inclusion. One of the forum's primary goals was to unify strategies aimed at documenting the Romani language, marking the first step toward creating written texts, studying the language, and developing appropriate educational materials. Romani has traditionally been passed down orally from generation to generation within the Romani community, but it lacks a documented, registered, or preserved written linguistic corpus. The forum also highlighted the importance of promoting the Romani language as a strategy to combat antigypsyism, fostering social inclusion and cultural recognition.

The forum's proceedings will culminate in a document containing key recommendations from the participants, which will be publicly available through the media and shared with relevant institutions to encourage solutions and implementation. IRCA remains committed to organizing inclusive activities and is confident that this first forum in Elbasan will become a tradition, serving as a platform to share best practices, progress, challenges, and the ongoing need for further interventions in the field of Romani language and culture.

### Moments...













IRCA is implementing the project "Support for Roma Micro-Entrepreneurs in Albania Towards Better Environmental Sustainability", funded by the ASSOCIATION FONDATION EUROPEENNE DE LA SCIENCE (ESF) under the ACCTING project. The initiative promotes environmental preservation by helping at least 60 Roma micro-entrepreneurs adopt eco-friendly practices, reducing pollution, protecting biodiversity, and mitigating climate change.

The project provides tailored professional training for at least 20 participants to build sustainable businesses, while 10 selected micro-entrepreneurs receive personalized expert advice and material support. A key outcome is the establishment of the Coalition of Green Roma Micro-Entrepreneurs (CRGM) and an online platform to facilitate networking and knowledge sharing among sustainability-oriented businesses. To inspire broader adoption of green practices, three outstanding Roma entrepreneurs will be awarded prizes. This project addresses the underexplored link between climate change and business in Albania, especially among marginalized groups, fostering environmental sustainability in micro-enterprises.


With the financial support of the **Albanian Helsinki Committee**, IRCA is implementing the project "Roma Youth Ambassadors of a Corruption-free Society". The project aims to combat the prevailing culture of tolerance towards corruption in Albania by promoting an anti-corruption mindset among Roma youth and strengthening partnerships with local authorities to ensure equal services for all citizens. Project aims to build a corruption-free society where Roma communities can access equal opportunities and services.





#### **Human Histories Exhibition**

With support from RYCO and in partnership with QHPSM, IRCA implemented the project "The Exhibition of Human Histories." This initiative addressed sensitive issues faced by young people, including gender inequality, civic engagement, human rights, minority concerns, violence, economic challenges, and migration, using art as a medium. Young participants were trained in storytelling to share their personal experiences and convey important societal messages. Twenty young individuals (10 from Albania and 10 from Kosovo) served as storytelling ambassadors, and their stories were showcased to the public through a curated exhibition. The project successfully enhanced the capacities of young people, established a network for collaboration, and identified common challenges and opportunities. By using art as a therapeutic tool, the initiative contributed to improving the lives of young participants while fostering dialogue and understanding across borders.

We Empower the Roma Minority to Exercise Their Democratic Rights in the Central Elections

IRCA is implementing the project "We Empower the Roma Minority to Exercise Their Democratic Rights in the Central Elections" with the financial support of the U.S. Embassy's Democracy Commission Small Grants Program in Tirana. This initiative is being carried out in 10 municipalities: Fier, Vlora, Tirana, Lushnje, Divjakë, Elbasan, Berat, Shkodër, Roskovec, and Cërrik. The project aims to empower Roma communities by increasing their awareness of their democratic rights and encouraging greater voter participation in the upcoming 2025 Parliamentary Elections in Albania. Through targeted outreach, education, and engagement activities, the initiative seeks to ensure that Roma individuals are fully informed and actively involved in the electoral process.





Erasmus Plus project "Mitigating Migration Challenges in the Western Balkans: Bridging the Skills Gap for Social Care Providers via Curricula Enhancement and Micro-Credential Development" (WB-Edu4Migration)

On November 1, 2024, IRCA joined the three-year Erasmus Plus project "Mitigating Migration Challenges in the Western Balkans: Bridging the Skills Gap for Social Care Providers via Curricula Enhancement and Micro-Credential Development" (WB-Edu4Migration). This collaborative initiative involves universities and civil society organizations from Kosovo, Albania, Austria, Italy, and Denmark, working together to address the complex challenges posed by migration in the region.

The project focuses on empowering social workers and improving the academic framework in Albania and Kosovo by revising and updating relevant academic literature and curricula. By incorporating modern methodologies and creating micro-credential opportunities, the project aims to equip social care providers with the necessary skills and knowledge to respond effectively to migration-related issues.

A key objective is to bridge the existing skills gap in the social care sector, ensuring service providers are well-prepared to support migrants and their families. This effort includes capacity-building initiatives, cross-border collaboration, and the development of innovative training modules that reflect the evolving needs of migration-affected communities. Through these measures, the project seeks to contribute to sustainable solutions for migration challenges in the Western Balkans.

### Other significant achievements throughout 2024:

In addition to the successful implementation of projects and signing of long-term contracts, IRCA actively participated in a series of important initiatives both domestically and internationally.

### **♣** Enhancing Youth Capacities for Online Safety

As part of a broader initiative to promote cybersecurity awareness, IRCA, in collaboration with the National Cybersecurity Authority, organized a series of interactive sessions targeting young people. These sessions aimed to equip participants with the knowledge and tools necessary to navigate the digital environment safely and responsibly. The discussions focused on critical issues, including the identification and mitigation of risks associated with the digital world, practical steps for safeguarding personal data, and strategies to prevent and address cyberbullying. Recognizing that cyberbullying disproportionately affects young people, the sessions emphasized the importance of fostering a culture of respect and awareness in online spaces. Participants were introduced to real-life scenarios and practical techniques to recognize potential threats, respond effectively to incidents, and adopt proactive measures to protect themselves and others. The campaign underlined the need for continuous education and vigilance in the face of evolving cyber risks, highlighting the role of young people as key actors in creating a safer digital community.





### Strategic Meeting with Local Structures in Vlorë

IRCA held a strategic meeting with the Mayor of Vlorë and representatives from local structures to discuss potential joint efforts for the implementation of projects focusing on infrastructure, housing, socio-economic empowerment, and social inclusion. The goal of the meeting was to explore collaborative approaches between IRCA, local government authorities, and community stakeholders to address the pressing challenges faced by vulnerable communities in Vlorë. Key discussions revolved around improving infrastructure in marginalized neighborhoods, enhancing access to basic services like water and sanitation, and identifying opportunities to improve housing conditions for Roma families and other vulnerable groups. Additionally, the meeting focused on developing strategies for socio-economic empowerment, such as providing job training, skills development, and fostering local businesses. The importance of social inclusion was emphasized, with a focus on ensuring equal access to resources and opportunities for all members of society. The Mayor of Vlorë and local representatives showed a strong commitment to these initiatives, recognizing the need for collaboration between local government, civil society, and international partners. This meeting was a significant step in advancing Vlorë's vision for inclusive urban development and the empowerment of marginalized groups. The joint projects discussed aim to create lasting positive impacts on the lives of vulnerable populations in Vlorë, contributing to a more equitable and sustainable future for the community.













### Gratitude for Promoting Gender Equality

The Executive Director of IRCA has been honored with the "Men and Boys Who Inspire for Gender Equality 2024 Award" 👸 🖫 for his significant contributions to advancing gender equality through the Youth Voice Network of Organizations. Just as there are countless inspiring women and girls fighting for their rights, this award serves as recognition for all the brave men and boys who stand alongside them in this shared battle for equality.



### **♣** Piloting the Community Work Initiative

As part of employment programs, IRCA is piloting the Community Work Project, which takes cultural factors into account to integrate individuals into the labor market.








### IRCA Promoted as a Success Story on Journalift


#### IRCA Participates in the Dialogue on Roma Minority Integration

# Success Story: Finding Oneself Through Passion - Ana's Story and the Importance of Psychological Support

What's the first word that comes to mind when you hear about childhood? What emotions do you experience when recalling events from your childhood? In fact, when we talk about childhood, we should all have colourful memories of and positive feelings! Childhood should be an idyllic garden and the place of our dreams of, where we could return without a second thought whenever we needed security and reflection!

But experience has shown us that childhood can resemble a faint \$\vec{\psi}\$ shadow, sometimes even a dark one! For many people, childhood is a period filled with challenges, difficulties, tears, and pain! And this picture describes Ana, a 14-year-old girl living in a remote area of Fier.

The IRCA team met Ana near her home... if it can even be called a home! The house where the girl lived with her two younger brothers  $\odot$   $\odot$  and mother was in miserable conditions! Their life resembled more of a survival than actual living!

The mother introduced us to Ana, a 14-year-old girl full of dreams and fears. Ana had been unable to attend school for several reasons. Her school was very far  $\mbox{\mbox{$\Lambda$}}$  from her home, and Ana was afraid to go alone! The surrounding area was uninhabited, and they had often encountered people who harassed them. Besides the distance, Ana's family could not afford to buy books  $\mbox{\mbox{\mbox{$\Lambda$}}}$ , clothes  $\mbox{\mbox{\mbox{$\Lambda$}}}$ , or the necessary tools to enable her proper education. The mother was unemployed, while the father lived far away, and their contacts were minimal.

Ana told us that these years had been a difficult journey for her, filled with challenges and limitations. She often felt lonely and hopeless. While her peers went to school and played, Ana spent her days thinking about the uncertain future that awaited her. Ana confided to the psychologists that she spent her days locked in a room, constantly feeling deep anxiety and sadness. The psychologists communicated with Ana for a long time. They guided her on self-calming techniques , emotional management, and self-esteem building.

As time passed, Ana began to see life differently. She began to understand that even though she couldn't



attend school for a certain period of time, she had skills and talents that she could develop. The psychological staff helped her discover a passion for art and photography , a hobby that allowed her to express herself and find solace.

Ana's story highlights the importance of psychological support for children and youth who face significant challenges and barriers. 

On the other hand, her case is a call for the importance of mobilizing and integrating all services, beyond economic assistance!

The accompanying photo to this story is a meaningful one! In this photo, not just images are captured, but also feelings, emotions, resilience, and a call for the importance of psychological support across all age groups.



### Success Story: The Power of Language, the Power of Silence!

Language is undoubtedly the primary instrument of communication throughout psychotherapy! Through speaking and narration, we address problems or try to make sense of our dilemmas and questions.

But, language barriers can also undermine the psychological process. There are so many ways in which individuals engaged in psychological sessions communicate: sometimes by saying things they don't want to say out loud to, but express through non-verbal language, sometimes by sharing things they don't yet understand, and often by sending mixed messages that need to be clarified in the context of a safe environment.

The experience with the Roma community and other individuals from marginalized groups gave a whole new meaning to the psychological support provided by the IRCA team. This experience is something we want to share more widely , as a necessary approach to apply with vulnerable communities, who are a continuous call for one of the greatest human needs: Understand me!

The psychological process goes beyond diagnosing according to set criteria; psychological support is about helping individuals facing psychological difficulties  $\heartsuit$  to discover and make sense of their experiences. People need to feel heard in a safe environment, characterized by empathy and non-judgment  $\heartsuit$ . But what happens when we encounter individuals from different cultural, educational  $\boxminus$ , or social backgrounds? How do we assess whether the therapeutic process has been successful and that what we've heard and conveyed has been understood accurately?

First, it is important to match the language level of the people engaged in psychological sessions, and to inform them about the shared journey through a culturally sensitive approach. Psychological sessions should provide opportunities to clarify goals and uncertainties, creating a rhythm of open and non-judgmental communication. And since the language of therapy is about giving meaning ;;;, it is crucial to demonstrate adaptation and sensitivity during psychological sessions, conveying beyond words the message and feeling of being understood and heard!

Throughout the implementation of the project, the IRCA psychology staff, during their work with the Roma community and/or returnees, paid great attention to the non-verbal aspects that allow them to capture nuances of communication that go beyond words... a forced smile  $\bigcirc$ , avoidance of eye contact  $\bigcirc$ , a change in body posture... We realized that some of the individuals communicate more clearly through art



and play rather than words. Some of them chose to use metaphors to describe how they felt, others chose folk stories , and some chose play , art, or writing .

When we recognize and understand the preferred ways of communication, the therapeutic bond is stronger, as the individual feels heard and understood.

Let's compare the verbal and non-verbal communication of an individual we are offering psychological support to with a foreign language. When we learn that language, there is less loss in translation. Speaking the same language enriches communication, increases trust, and strengthens the psychological relationship. This is the power of language!

Often, psychological sessions may be characterized by long pauses and very little narration. In one of the recent activities, a group of young girls sat in silence for several minutes, just looking into each other's eyes. They were using the safe environment to reflect on themselves, to feel the emotions, and to create a connection between them, which perhaps goes beyond some cliché words. At the end of the session, one of the girls stood up perhaps on behalf of all the other girls who had the same story nand said: "Today, I spoke more than any other day in my life, I spoke in silence! Today, I felt completely understood, I finally understood myself too!" And at the same time, this is the power of silence!
